*****RULES OF CONDUCT – For Players, Parents, Spectators, Coaches, and Umpires:**

All participants in Parks and Recreation programs, including players, parents, spectators, coaches, and umpires, will treat each other with courtesy and respect at all times.

Unsportsmanlike behavior, including (but not limited to) vulgar language, derogatory comments, threatening words or actions, or physical violence of any kind will not be tolerated.

Disciplinary action can and will be taken, if warranted.

Umpires have the right to eject players, parents, spectators or coaches from the game or game area. If more severe sanctions are recommended, the Parks and Recreation's policies will be followed (copies of this policy are available upon request).

- I. Coach's Expectations
 - A. Each coach must sign and return the attached "Pledge of Ethics."
 1. All coaches will be held to all Pledge standards for the duration of the season.
 - B. Each coach will agree to having a background check ran and their name run through the sex offender registry.
- II. Coaches' Meeting
 - A. At least one representative from each team **MUST** attend the pre-season coaches' meeting. Failure to attend this meeting will result in the team's being ineligible to play.
- III. Rosters, Waivers, Payment**
 - A. A complete team roster is due at the coaches' meeting.**
 - B. Signed waivers for every child are due no later than the coaches' meeting.**
 - C. Full payment is due no later than the coaches' meeting.**
- IV. Eligibility
 - A. Age Limits
 1. *10 and Under:* Any child who is currently 9 years old and who will not be 11 by May 1st of the current year OR is currently in the 4th grade
 2. *12 and Under:* Any child who is currently 11 years old and who will not be 13 by May 1st of the current year OR is currently in the 6th grade.
 3. *14 and Under:* Any child who is currently 13 years old and who will not be 15 by May 1st of the current year OR is currently in the 8th grade

B. Birth Certificates and Contracts

1. Each player must provide a copy of his/her birth certificate and a signed Players' Contract to the Parks and Recreation Department prior to the start of the season. These copies will not be returned.
2. A new contract and birth certificate copy are required each year.
3. If a player is on a high school roster, proof is required.

C. Maximum Players per Team

1. A maximum of fifteen (15) players per team is allowed. All players must be listed on the official roster.

D. Roster and Payment

1. A team's complete payment and roster with players' names, birth dates, addresses, ages, coaches names and phone numbers must be turned in WITH all signed contracts and birth certificate copies one week prior to the start of the season. *If all information is not on file, the team will be considered ineligible and will forfeit each game until the information is on file.*

E. Transfers

1. A player must remain on his/her original team as long as the player and the team are eligible for the league, unless she meets the following criteria:
 - a. Player must obtain a transfer form from the team he/she wishes to leave.
 - b. The manager of the current team and the team the player wishes to go to must provide written acceptance of the transfer to the Parks and Recreation Department within seven (7) days.
 - c. The transfer must be approved by the Parks and Recreation Department.
 - d. Players cannot transfer or be added to a team after 20 days from the date of the first scheduled league game.
 - e. Once a player has transferred to a new team, he/she must remain with that team for the rest of the season.

V. Ineligibility and Forfeiture

- A. If a player is deemed ineligible, games in which they have participated will be forfeited. Circumstances include:
 1. Playing in the wrong age group
 2. Playing under an assumed name
 3. Playing without being on the official team roster
 4. Playing without properly authorized transfer forms
- B. Failure to show up for a ball game will result in a forfeit.
- C. Failure to play all players the minimum amount of time as required by Rule VII will result in a forfeit.

VI. Scoring and Make-ups

- A. *****All Leagues:** If teams reschedule games (non-rainouts), they will be assessed a \$10 fee. This fee is payable BEFORE umpires are scheduled for the proposed game.
- B. **10 and Under:** There are no official scores kept for this league. Rainouts and cancellations will not be made up.
- C. **12 and Under, 14 and Under:**
 1. Official scores will be kept for this league. Rainouts will be rescheduled.
 2. Cancellations (made in agreement with the other team and prior to the day of the game) can be made up if both teams agree.

3. If both teams cannot agree to a make-up time in advance, the team that cancels will receive the forfeit.
4. If a game is cancelled on the day it is to be played, it is a forfeit.

VII. Field Measurements and Equipment

- A. *10 and Under*: 65' bases, 46' pitching, USSSA regulation baseball.
- B. *12 and Under*: 70' bases, 50' pitching, USSSA regulation baseball.
- C. *14 and Under*: 80' bases, 54' pitching, USSSA regulation baseball.
- D. Stationary bases will be provided at the Council Bluffs Recreation Complex and Bahnsen Park only. Teams playing at Bahnsen Park will be responsible for setting out bases and returning them to the box. Key required will be provided at the Coaches' Meeting.
- E. A coin toss will determine the home team. Home teams must put out the bases, and will sit on the third base side of the field.

VIII. Length of Games

A. *10 and Under*

1. Time limit, including ties: 1 hour, 30 minutes
2. Games shall be measured by time limits, not innings.
3. An inning started before the end of the time limit may be completed.
4. Maximum batters per inning: 10

B. *12 and Under*

1. Time limit, including ties: 1 hour, 50 minutes
2. Innings needed for a complete game: 7
3. Innings needed for a complete game in rainouts or with 10 run rule: 4

C. *14 and Under*

1. Time limit, including ties: 1 hour, 50 minutes
2. Innings needed for a complete game: 7
3. Innings needed for a complete game in rainouts or with 10 run rule: 4

D. *Time Limits for Tied Games (12 and Under, 14 and Under)*

1. No new inning after time limit in league play.
2. The final inning may be completed if it began before time limit.
3. If a game ends in a tie after the allotted time, a ½ point is awarded to each team.

E. *Other Rules (10 and Under)*

1. Players are not allowed to steal home or run on a dropped third strike

F. *Other Rules (12 and Under, 14 and Under)*

1. If a game is stopped due to inclement weather, it will begin at the same point it was suspended when it is made up.
2. There is a ten minute forfeiture for the first game only.

IX. Player Participation

A. *10 and Under*

1. Each player must play AT LEAST two innings (twelve consecutive outs).
2. A maximum of ten players can bat in one half of the inning. The coach must notify the other that the tenth is their last batter. (This rule is not in effect for tournaments).
3. All players batting order is allowed.
4. Pinch running does not qualify under the participation rule.

5. Runners can lead off bases. A mark is placed on the third base foul line within five feet of the base.

B. *12 and Under and 14 and Under*

1. All participants must play AT LEAST six consecutive outs.
2. All players batting order is allowed.
3. Pinch running does not qualify under the participation rule.

X. Pitching

A. *All Leagues*

1. Coaches must keep a log for each pitcher, including number of outs and innings per day.
2. The log must be presented to the opposing coach and umpire at the home plate meeting, five minutes before game time.
3. Pitching rules must be strictly adhered to, for the safety of the pitchers.

B. *10 and Under*

1. If a player pitches in FOUR or more innings, he/she must have THREE calendar days of rest.
2. Each pitcher may only pitch a MAXIMUM of six innings per calendar week.

C. *12 and Under*

1. If a player pitches in FOUR or more innings, he/she must have TWO calendar days of rest.
2. Each pitcher may only pitch a MAXIMUM of seven innings per calendar week. Examples:

D. *14 and Under*

1. If a player pitches in FOUR or more innings, he/she must have ONE calendar day of rest.
2. Each pitcher may only pitch a MAXIMUM of eight innings per calendar week. Examples:

XI. Protests

- A. All protests must be written up and turned in within 24 hours (72 hours if the game is on a Friday or Saturday).
- B. Correct procedures, as outlined on the protest form in the back of this rule book, must be followed, or the protest will not be considered valid.
- C. There is a \$25.00 fee for each protest. If the protest is upheld, the fee will be returned.
- D. A committee comprised of a minimum of at least three non members (ideally, one coach, one umpire, and one representative from Parks and Recreation) will hear and decide on each protest.
- E. The committee's decision cannot be protested.

XII. Uniforms and Sponsorship

1. All players must have a number on his/her jersey.
2. No metal spikes allowed. Tennis and soccer shoes are allowed.
3. Full uniforms are required, including all equipment (catcher's gear, batting and base runner helmets, etc.).
4. Sponsorships are allowed BUT no "adult business" sponsorships (i.e. bars).

XIII. Awards

A. *10 and Under*

1. All participants will receive a participation award from the Parks and Recreation Department at the end of the season.
2. Awards will be available before the final game.

B. *12 and Under, 14 and Under*

1. First and second place trophies will be awarded to top finishers in these leagues.
2. If there is more than one division, first and second place trophies will be given out for each division.
3. Trophies will be available after scores from the final games have been recorded in the Parks and Recreation office.
